WHAT IS EXPECTED DURING THE SUPERVISED VISIT

The supervisor has a duty to observe and intercede in all interactions between the supervised parent and the child/children in order to protect and promote the health, safety, and welfare of the child/children. The supervisor has the authority to end the visit at any time in which the supervisor believes that the child/children's health, safety, and/or welfare is at risk and/or the below-listed behaviors of the supervised parent occur. The supervisor is to be present at all child/children exchange(s) between the parents, accompanying the children at all times beginning from the exchange to the supervised parent until the exchange from the supervised parent to the custodial parent or person designated by the custody parent as responsible for parenting tie exchanges. The supervisor will be present and accompany the child/children in any transportation of the child/children by the parent being supervised. The driver of any vehicle in which the child/children are to be transported must have a currently valid Arizona Driver License, current vehicle registration, and current automobile insurance.

The supervised parent is encouraged to plan the visit ahead of time, so that the visit is age-appropriate and enjoyable for the child/children. The supervised parent is responsible for providing all age-appropriate games, books, toys, sports equipment, games as well as all foods, snacks, and drinks for the child/children. The visitation is for the child/children and the supervised parent, unless court orders allow for the presence of other family members. Relationship partners, such as spouses, boyfriends, or girlfriends of the supervised parents are not permitted unless otherwise stated in the court orders for supervised visitation. The court expects an environment for the child that is free from anger and unkind remarks. This is the time for the supervised parent to build a positive relationship and create a pleasant experience with the child involved.

Certain acts or behaviors by the supervising parent are not permitted, including but not limited to the following:

- **No emotional, physical or sexual abuse.** Spanking and hitting is prohibited. Physical abuse could also include such things as pinching, pulling the child, tickling too hard, and playing too rough. Emotional and verbal abuse includes such behavior as yelling and screaming; calling the child names such as "sissy", "stupid", or "dumb"; blaming and accusing the child; making fun of the child; threatening the child with physical abuse, harm to his or her loved ones and animals; or threatening, frightening situations for the child like abandonment or loss of a home and friends. Sexual abuse includes inappropriate touching of the child's body and inappropriate or suggestive language.
- **No visits to occur when the parent is suggested (by supervisor) to be under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs.** This is grounds for preventing and/ending a visit.
- **No spanking, hitting or threatening the child/children.**
- **The child/children shall not be used to gather information about the other parent or transmit information, personal possessions or papers.**
- **No discussions of the court case or possible outcomes.** The visits are about the relationship between the non-custodial parent and the child. It can be very stressful for children to hear about the court case.
- **No negative and or derogatory comments about the other parent, his or her family, caretaker, child, or child's brothers and sisters.**
